


Incorporating Employment as a Social Determinant of Health (SDoH) in the Electronic Medical Record

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Employment Status as a SDoH ("Why working is good for health")

- Work meets important psychosocial needs in societies where employment is the norm
- Work is central to individual identity, social roles and social status
- Employment and socio-economic status are the main drivers of social gradients in physical and mental health and mortality




Unemployment is associated with*:

- Higher mortality
- Worse general health, long-standing illness, limiting longstanding illness
- Higher medical consultation, medication consumption and hospital admission rates



SDOH "Wheel" in the Electronic Medical Record does not include employment







EPIC Tools

SDoH Questions:

- Current employment status (Pick list)
- Last date worked (cascading if patient not currently working)

Risk Scoring:

- High Risk (Red):
 - · Employed but not working due to illness or injury
 - · Temporary Disabled
- Moderate Risk (Yellow):
 - · Employed but not working due to furlough
 - · Working with temporary restrictions
 - Unemployed/not in the paid workforce but seeking employment
- Low Risk (Green):
 - · Employed and actively working without restrictions
 - Permanently disabled
 - Retired
 - · Unemployed/not in the paid workforce and NOT seeking employment

EPIC Tools Continued

Employment Registry:

- All patients at medium/high risk
- Used to identify patients for RETAIN program

RETAIN Registry:

All patients with an active Employment episode

Reporting Workbench Reports:

 Displays patients from registries to facilitate recruitment/track outreach
